1. The following shoulder sleeve insignia were cancelled as of 12 July 1973:

a. U.S. Army Medical Training Center, Drawing No. A-1-279, 30 January 1959, revised 10 December 1968.

→ b. U.S. Army Combat Developments Command, Drawing No. A-1-299, 12 July 1962, revised 25 September 1968.

2. The U.S. Army Medical Training Center, Fort Sam Houston, TX was discontinued effective 30 June 1973 per CONARC General Orders No. 121, dated 23 May 1973. The U.S. Army Combat Developments Command was discontinued effective 1 July 1973 per DA General Orders No. 16, dated 18 May 1973. Neither of these insignia is authorized for wear on the right shoulder sleeve.

SUBJECT: Shoulder Sleeve Insignia

TO: Commanding General

1. Reference is made to your letter, subject as above, dated 20 June 1962.

2. The Department of the Army General Staff has approved the requested design of shoulder sleeve insignia for the Combat Developments Command with the exception that it is to be without tab. The description and symbolism of the insignia are as follows:

DESCRIPTION

On a red disk 2 inches in diameter a white arrowhead, point up, containing a blue five-pointed star, its upper point extended.

SYMBOLISM

The star is symbolic of command and its extended upper point emphasizes direction and purpose. The arrowhead denotes the combat aspect of the operation.

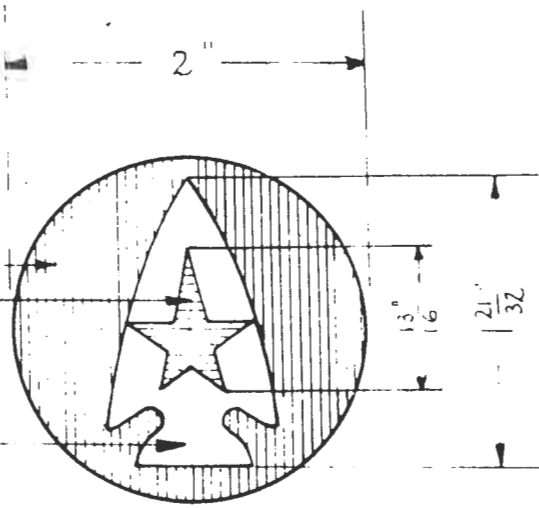
3. Expeditious action is being taken by this Institute toward the development of the insignia in order that procurement may be effected at the earliest possible date.

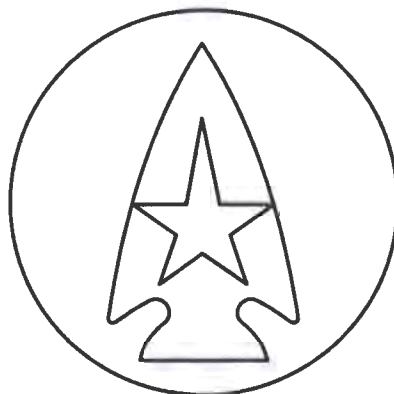
