SUBJECT: Shoulder Sleeve Insignia for the 194th Armored Brigade

1. The shoulder sleeve insignia originally approved 13 January 1966 for the 194th Armored Brigade is amended this date to revise the symbolism. This amendment deletes the reference to the past combat development experimentation mission and includes the letter "X" as a reference to the military symbol for brigades.

2. The description and symbolism of the design are as follows:

DESCRIPTION

On a shield 2 inches overall in width and 2 3/8 inches overall in height per chevron reversed and abased yellow and per pale blue and red, a black mace and a black battle-ax saltirewise all within a 1/8 inch yellow border.

SYMBOLISM

The colors yellow, blue and red are used for principal combat arms elements of an Armored organization. The crossed mace and battle-ax allude to assault tactics and the shield to defense. The crossed weapons also simulate the letter "X" as a reference to the military symbol for brigades.

3. This authorization is in accordance with paragraph 26-16a, AR 670-1.

4. This authorization letter will become a part of the permanent organizational history files of the organization in accordance with File No. 228-08, AR 340-2 or AR 340-18-2, as applicable.

SUBJECT: Distinctive Insignia (Badge) for the Noncolor Bearing Units of the 19th Armored Brigade

TO: Commanding General
19th Armored Brigade
Fort Ord, California 93941

1. The distinctive insignia (badge) for the noncolor bearing units of the 19th Armored Brigade is authorized. The description and symbolism of the design are as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A gold color metal and enamel insignia 1 1/8 inches in height consisting of a black mace with handle to base between three flashes of blue, gold and red from left to right; overall in base an arched golden scroll inscribed with the words "Thunderbolts of Battle" in black letters.

SYMBOLISM

The colors yellow, blue and red represent the principal combat arms element of an Armored organization. The mace alludes to the smashing power of armor and the unit's participation in the Central European campaign of World War II. The flashes refer to the motto "Thunderbolts of Battle."

2. The distinctive insignia will be worn as prescribed in AR 670-5.
3. This authorization letter will become a permanent file of the organization in accordance with File No. 206-06 Organizational history files, AR 345-210.
4. This authorization is in accordance with the following:
 - a. Paragraph 139, Change 2, AR 670-5, dated 5 April 1962.
 - b. Letter AGAO-O (M) 322 (26 Nov 62), DCSFER, dated 4 December 1962, as amended by letter AGAO-O (M) (17 Jan 63) DCSFER, dated 17 January 1963.

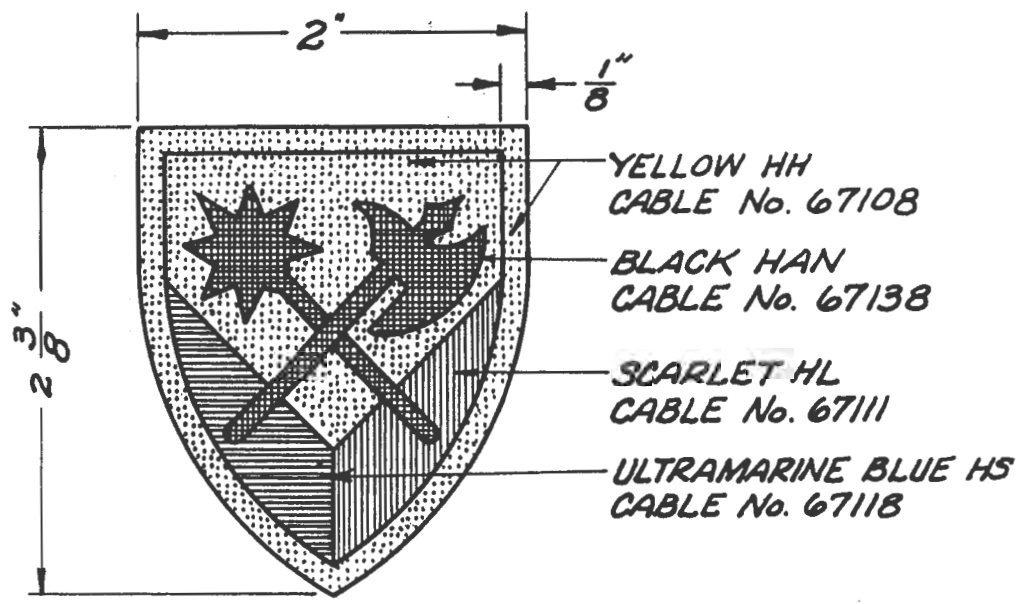

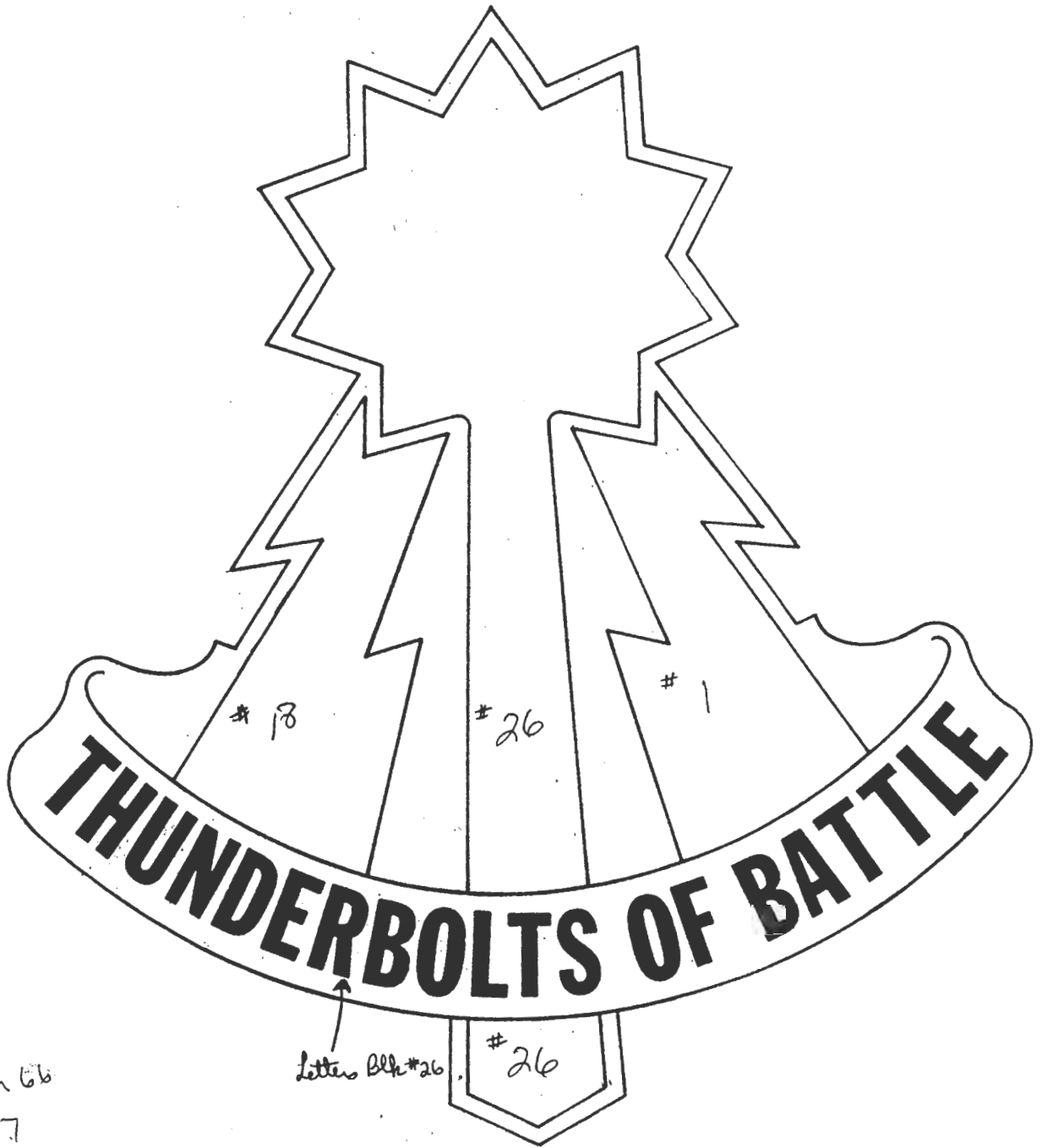
