1. Letter AGAH-A, subject as above, dated 30 July 1968, is amended to change the description as follows:

DESCRIPTION

On a blue upright rectangle two inches in width and three inches in height, semicircular at the top and with a 1/8 inch white border all around, a white three pointed castle tower charged with a blue five pointed star, single point uppermost, above a red base with four battlements fimbriated white.

1. A shoulder sleeve insignia for the U. S. Army Engineer Command, Europe is authorized. It is described as follows:

DESCRIPTION

On a blue upright rectangle two inches in width and three inches in height, semicircular at the top and with an 1/8 inch white border all around, a white three pointed castle tower charged with a blue five pointed star, single point uppermost, above a red base with four battlements separated from the blue above and the red base below by a white fimbriation.

SYMBOLISM

Scarlet and white are the colors of the Corps of Engineers. The blue background denotes the Unit's origin in the Pacific Theater during World War II. The white tower silhouette represents the famous Eschenheimer Tower landmark of Frankfurt, Germany, where the Command was permanently established and the star alludes to the Unit's status as a permanent major activity under the direct control of the Commander in Chief, U. S. Army, Europe. The four battlements rising on the wall of the defensive fortification are inspired by the Engineer's castle insignia and further represent the multi-missions of the Command.


2. The shoulder sleeve insignia will be worn as prescribed in AR 670-5.

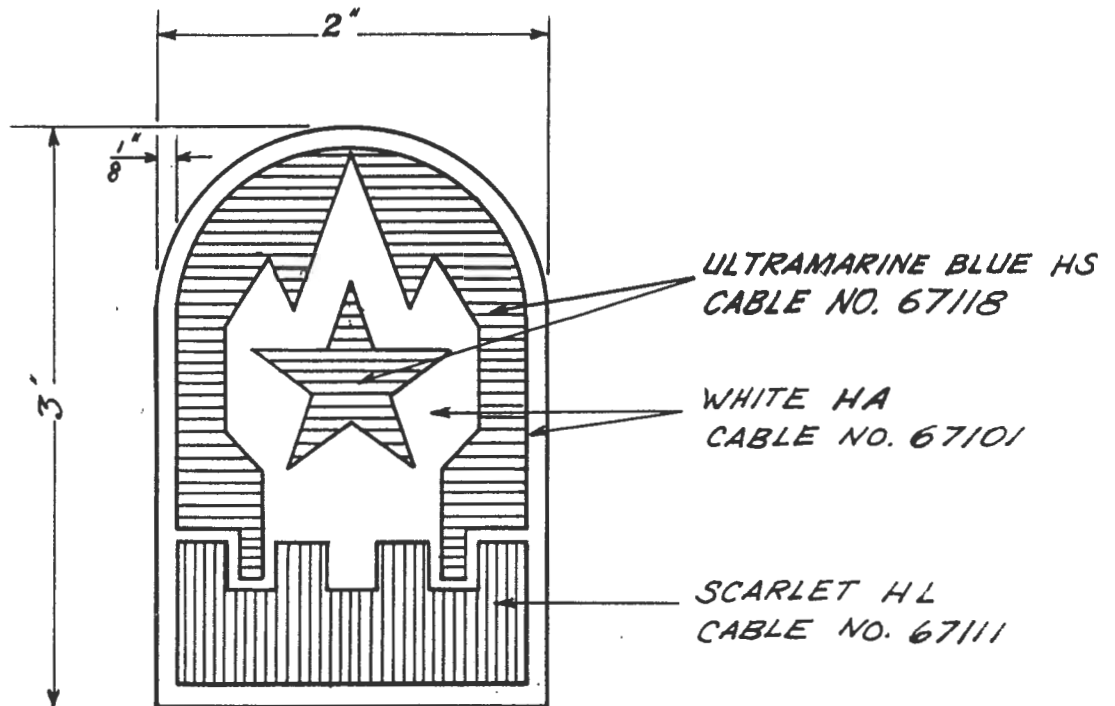

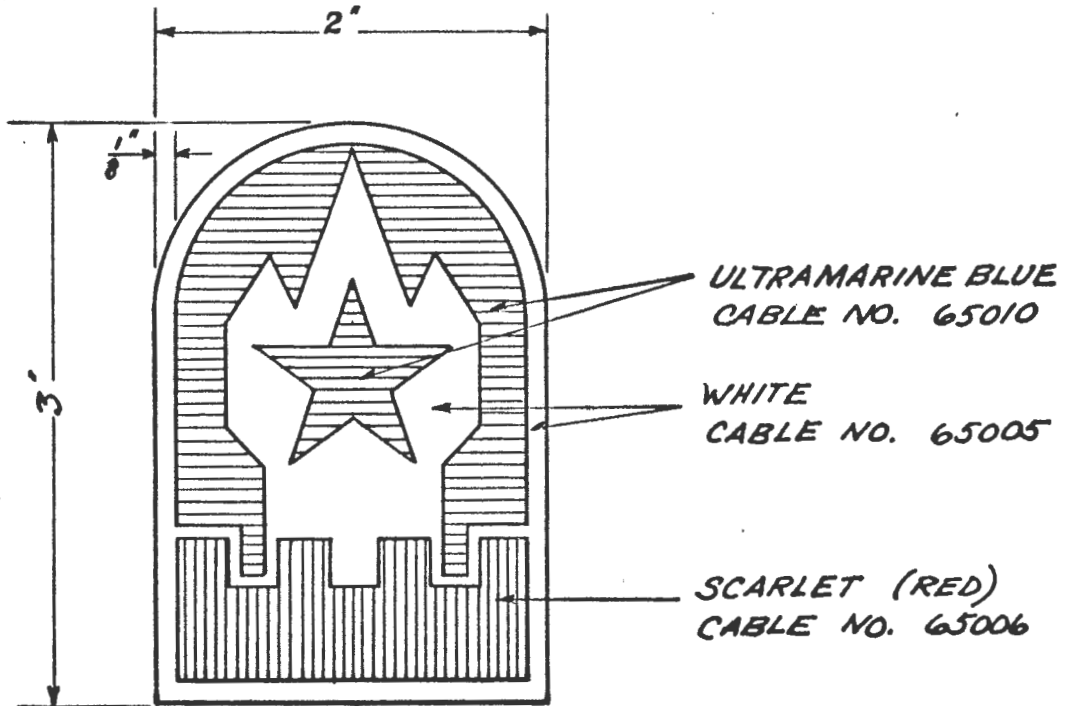

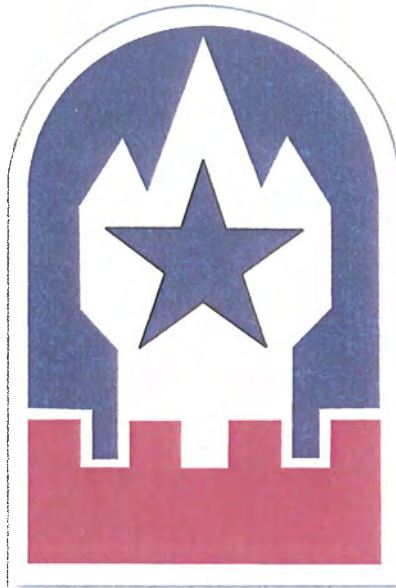
